

Not quite a book club, but an opportunity for neighbours to meet and get to know each other over a book.


We choose a title once or twice a year and come together to talk about it informally.

RIDGE CANOE AND KAYAK CLUB

RCKC had another busy and successful season!

Our Junior and Senior high performance athletes had a very successful competitive season, both locally and nationally. In May, RCKC hosted our Season Opening Regatta at Whonnock, bringing together over 100 paddlers from around the province, to kick off our competitive season.

Later in the Spring Brian Malfesi went to national team trials and qualified to go to the World Championships in Germany in August, where he placed fifth in the K2 1000m.

Eight of our athletes qualified for the Canadian National Championships, which took place in August at Lake Banoock in Dartmouth Nova Scotia. Brian, Ethan Hennig, Bryant Kelleway, Landon Drain, Tyler Billing, Adia Irvine-Roberts, Hayden McCulloch and Tyler Geisler. Most of these athletes made A Finals placing them in the top nine in the country!

Our competitive season ended in early September where we co-hosted the Fort - Ridge Fall Classic Regatta with the Fort Canoe Kayak Club at Whonnock Lake. This was the largest regatta this year in BC, hosting over 200 athletes from BC, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Yukon and Washington State.

RCKC also offers many recreational programs for our community. This year, we were able to run a full slate of one-day school camps for about 1400 students from Maple Ridge, Mission, Pitt Meadows and Coquitlam. We also were able to offer our normal week-long summer programs in conjunction with the Maple Ridge Recreation Department and hosted camps for both Scouts and Girl Guides.

In addition to our paddling and training efforts, RCKC athletes have been pleased to help the Maple Ridge Rotary, serving as clean-up crew for the Wine Festival and "Duck Herders" at the finish line of the Rotary Duck race this year.

As we write this update, fall is in the air. It is welcome, considering the many months without any significant precipitation.

There are deep concerns over dropping water levels and drought that have effected the coniferous trees, particularly the Cedars in our rural areas.

We are in conversation with the City as they are making plans regarding the concerns of fires in our dry and dying forests. For TAPS, the residents on shallow wells would have felt the impacts the most.

Hauling water became a daily occurrence for some. Water conservation has become paramount and discussions are underway regarding the best way to support residents as our climate changes.

Our well measuring data still shows that the deep wells are consistent with no major impacts on water levels. December measurements reflecting recharge will show if there have been any significant changes.

THE THORNHILL COMMUNITY HALL

The Thornhill Community Hall is one of a small number of independent Halls in BC run entirely by volunteers.

It thrives because of the work and care from a core group of volunteers. Fran & Al Norman and Don Morrey have dedicated more than 25 years to our Hall. That alone is rare.

They, with a core group of other volunteers, maintain the physical structure, support and enable local schools, community groups and many individual people to rent and enjoy the Hall.

These are the reasons for its success. Many residents and groups return to celebrate family events annually. We are fully booked to the end of the year.
