

TAPS (Thornhill Aquifer Protection Study)



TAPS is completing its 18th year of gathering data regarding well water levels during the 4 seasons and testing once a year for a chemical & bacterial analysis of the water from the Granthill Aquifer.

Klaus and I had a meeting with James Mack and Ted Zimmerman from the Watershed Stewardship and Security Branch to request protection of the Provincially owned Crown lands on the aquifer. They acknowledged our considerable efforts to understand and protect our aquifer. The current status is that the Province has no requests to develop it and so this land is considered vacant. Should an application come forward, the Ministry will put into place consultative measures including input from affected residents, First Nations and the City. The current status is wait and see.

We have consulted with the City regarding the current status of urban development on our aquifer and are awaiting a reply. This season has been wetter and cooler on the whole, so our shallow wells and deep wells have kept consistent levels this summer and Fall.

Please be cognizant of the effects of climate change and all the efforts we can make as individuals to protect our vulnerable environment.

Wishing you all a healthy winter season and appreciating the continued awareness of our special and vulnerable Granthill Aquifer.

Once again, the Whonnock Weavers and Spinners spent much of the summer getting ready for our hands-on exhibit at Country Fest. We spent many happy hours at a member's farm, washing and dyeing local fleece in bright colours that would appeal to children. We were happily inside at Country Fest this year, out of the heat, sharing Planet Ice with the Lower Mainland Sheep Producers Association. Our table full of brilliantly coloured fleece attracted many patrons, and we invited children to pick their favourite colour, help to card their wool, take it over to a spinner who spun their choice into yarn, and then made it into a bracelet. We also had weaving stations set up, with our members helping little hands to try weaving. Over 80 children wove a little mug rug, and over 200 happy faces went home wearing a colourful bracelet. It was a great way to pass our love of fibre arts onto the next generation.

The summer always goes by too quickly as we spend our days spinning, dyeing, making baskets, and weaving. As usual, we are spending the fall getting prepared for our **43rd annual Exhibit and Sale**. Once again, we will host this at the Whonnock Lake Centre, where we have held it for nearly 40 years. We would be pleased to welcome all of our friends in Whonnock – and beyond! This event will take place on **Sunday, November 24 from 10 am to 4 pm**. We would also like to thank the Whonnock Community Association for their continued support and help with our exhibit and sale. We really appreciate you.
