Please check the rest of this newsletter for upcoming events and we look forward with hope, to a happy and safe winter for all.




REMEMBRANCE DAY

WHONNOCK BURSARY

WHONNOCK AGAINST CELL TOWER



In April of this year, residents were notified of a Telus/Alcatel-Lucent proposal to locate a 60-meter cell phone tower on a residential property in Whonnock.

Residents immediately got together and formed the local group Whonnock ACT (Against Cell Tower), which spear-

headed a protest against this proposal. Local, provincial and federal governments were sent numerous letters, along with a signed petition from many in the community.

A presentation to council was made along with supportive letters from the Whonnock Community Association asking that the District withhold their concurrence of the proposed tower and establish a policy and procedures regarding this and future antenna sitings and consultation.

The following message was received by Whonnock ACT from Telus on May 28, 2012:

Mr. Connors (Industry Canada) and I have discussed the proposed project including the notification package. This site is temporarily withdrawn and not on the 2012 plan nor currently in the 2013 plan.

As TELUS explores alternate solutions for the much needed service in the area, and eventually decides to explore a different location or pursue this one, Mr. Connors and I agreed that a new notification package would be sent to residents.



ONE BOOK WHONNOCK

The final tally for those reading *Obasan* was 60 – thanks to everyone who participated in exploring a work of literature and its connection to own neighbourhood!

ONE BOOK WHONNOCK ended this, its first project, with a happy gathering at Whonnock Lake Centre. Twenty-one neighbours came to discuss Obasan and get acquainted. Participants had lived here for a few months and for many decades. They told stories of their knowledge of the Japanese-Canadians who lived in our area before World War Two, and brought memorabilia to show. We saw maps of where the confiscated properties in this area were; we saw a document passing a Japanese-Canadian farm to a local woman to tend in their absence (subsequently countermanded by a letter from the government that she had no claim because they now owned the property); we saw lesson plans developed for teaching local students about this now; we saw photos of some former residents now hauntingly nameless. One person told of their own internment in the Second World War. A fictional story brought real life stories to the fore.

ONE BOOK WHONNOCK is starting its second project. The flyer on page 8 gives details. We hope you will sign up and read The Corpse with the Silver Tongue by Cathy Ace. If you love sunshine, good food, history, colourful characters and/or puzzle-solving, this book will draw you in. The local connection to this book is that the author lives in Whonnock, and is willing to participate in the project with us. What an opportunity for a riveting read and an inside look at mystery-writing. Thanks, Cathy!


